Opportunity Statements are the industry standard to identify a problem and pitch a solution. The provided template (text entry fields in the application form) will help you focus your thoughts on what is essential and facilitate the matching process.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Focus on one problem and one BME course per statement. If you would like to address more than one problem, then submit a separate statement for each problem. Please limit your submission to a max of two statements per course.
- Be reminded that this is not a channel to provide feedback or evaluation about the instructor of the course or their teaching style. Therefore, please be objective when describing the problem and the suggested solution.
- The OIS template will have the following <u>four</u> parts with a <u>200 word limit per part</u>:
 - 1. The current problem is....
 - 2. The effect of the current problem on the students is
 - 3. The suggested solution is
 - 4. The effect of the suggested solution on the students is
- Take your time to draft your OIS parts. You can always close the browser and return to the application form later, using the same link.
- Please stick to the suggested word count in each part of the OIS.
